

Creating QR Codes

A QR code is a scannable barcode that takes you to a website or video, gives information, text or other information. A QR Reader is required to "scan" the barcode. QR Readers can be installed on Smartphones, ipod touches with cameras, iPad 2s, and webcams (if your computer has QR reader software).

| <p style="text-align: center;">Creating a Text QR Code:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Plain Text as the Data Type (Step 1). 2. Type Text in the Text Box (Step 2). 3. Select Color if you want a color other than black (Step 3 - optional). 4. Select Download QR Code. 5. Select Open when prompted. 6. Right click on the QR Image. 7. Select Copy. 8. Open Word (or click on minimized Word Document). 9. Right click and select paste. 10. Right click (or double click) on the QR image and select Text Wrapping – Tight or Square options will make it easier to type around/next to your image. <p>Remember that the fewer characters/words, the better the scan!</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Creating a Text QR Code:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Free Text. 2. Type Text in the Text Box/Enter text to share here. 3. Options will let you select the size of the QR image – sometimes get a better scan if you want smaller or larger codes if you select the size you want rather than resizing in Word. 4. Select Save QR Code. 5. In Internet Explorer 9: Right click on the QR Image. Select Copy. 6. In Mozilla Firefox – Right Click – View Image and then Right Click – Copy) 7. Open Word (or click on minimized Word Document). 8. Right click and select paste. 9. Right click (or double click) on the QR image and select Text Wrapping – Tight or Square options will make it easier to type around/next to your image. |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Creating a Website QR Code</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Website URL as the Data Type (Step 1). 2. Open a 2nd tab in your browser and search for intended website url. 3. Select and highlight the website. 4. With mouse over the selected website - Right Click and Copy address. 5. Click on the QRstuff tab. 6. Single click in Website URL box (Step 2). 7. Right Click – Paste (or Control – V) 8. Select Color if you want a color other | <p style="text-align: center;">Creating a Website QR Code</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select URL. 2. Open a 2nd tab in your browser and search for intended website url. 3. Select and highlight the website. 4. With mouse over the selected website - Right Click and Copy address. 5. Click on the QR Code generator tab. 6. Single click in Enter URL box. 7. Right Click – Paste (or Control – V) 8. Select Shorten URL if it is a long website in order to make it “scannable”. (optional). |

9. Select **Download QR Code**.
 10. Repeat steps **5-10** above in the **TEXT QR Code directions** for copying the code and pasting it into your Word document.

Scroll down and select Print if you want to print a page of the same QR Codes.

10. Repeat steps **5-9** above in the **TEXT QR Code directions** for copying the code and pasting it into your Word document.

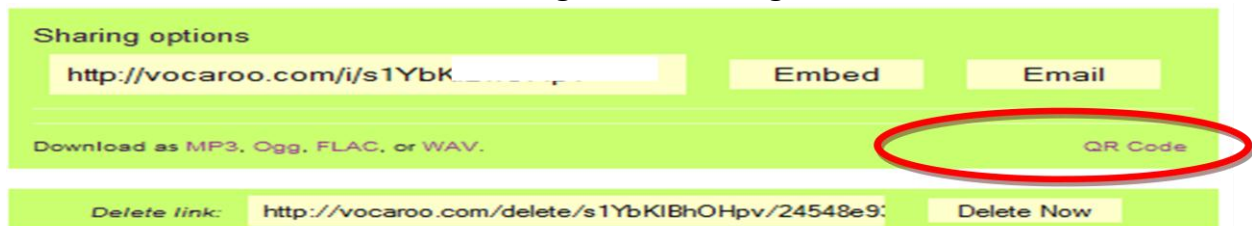
QR Voice - <http://qrvoice.net/>

Maximum length is 100 characters.

1. Click on **Say What** text box.
2. Press **Enter** on the keyboard or Select the **Generate QR Voice Button** at the end of the row.
3. Right click on the QR Image.
4. Select **Copy**.
5. Open Word (or click on minimized Word Document).
6. Right click and select **paste**.
7. Right click (or **double click**) on the QR image and select **Text Wrapping** – Tight or Square options will make it easier to type around/next to your image.

Vocaroo Online Voice Recording <http://vocaroo.com/>

1. Select **Click to Record**.
2. Select **Allow Microphone** when/if prompted. It will immediately start recording.
3. Click on **Stop**. Click Retry or Listen as needed.
4. Happy with the recording? – select the **Click here to save link**.
5. Select **QR Code link** at the bottom right of the image.



6. Follow directions 3-7 in the above QR Voice directions for copying and pasting the code. Since “technically” this is putting student voices online, I would suggest first names only for elementary students if they are essential when recording. Students on the FERPA/Do Not Release student info list - should not use their names at all.
